#### **ISAIAH 9:6-7**

In the midst of what's happening around the world, it is easy to be troubled. Our minds can quickly get littered with fears, questions, and anxious thoughts. But God—through the birth of Christ—made a beautiful promise of peace (shalom), which is more than just the absence of conflict or anxiety. It is a place of oneness, wholeness, and safety—the kind that transcends challenges and hard times. Today, we will look at how Jesus, our Messiah, is meant to restore our perfect shalom with God and rule over us with justice and righteousness.

# 1 Jesus is the promised King who will usher in peace.
