WARM-UP

WORD

"35 And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

Matthew 9:35,36

Jesus' response to seeing the crowds was compassion. He saw them differently from the way we might see crowds—as an irritation or inconvenience. Jesus urges us to fish for folks like He did when we follow Him (Matthew 4:19). We are to approach the lost in the same way He does, to have the same perspective as He does, and to act in the same manner as He does. We will examine three approaches to helping the lost in this lesson.

1. BE COMPASSIONATE

When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.

Matthew 9:36

Jesus saw that the crowds were harassed and helpless. He recognized them for what they truly were: lost sheep in need of a shepherd. He therefore purposefully went out to them out of sympathy for them. When you notice a crowd, what do you do? How have you grown in your ability to actively encourage others to follow Jesus?

2. BE CONNECTED

"The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!'"

Luke 7:34

| Because He enjoyed spending time with the lost, many religious people were |
|--|
| upset with Jesus. But, Jesus did this on purpose so that they could know Him |
| and repent of their sinful lifestyle. Similarly, if we solely associate with |
| Christians, we cannot reach out to the lost. Jesus set the example for us, and |
| we are to reach out to the lost in order to bring them back to God. How can |
| you keep fostering bonds with folks who have wandered off? Why are they |
| being engaged, exactly? |
